I issue this ORDER pursuant to ORS 1.060(3), including an extension of statutory time limitations pursuant to ORS 174.120(2)(c), due to the following emergency conditions in Marion County, Oregon:

Inclement weather and hazardous conditions, affecting the Supreme Court, the Court of Appeals, and the Tax Court.

I therefore ORDER as follows:

- 1. This order applies to the described court operations in the Supreme Court, the Court of Appeals, and the Tax Court, on February 23, 2023.
- 2. The courts are closed, within the meaning of ORS 1.060(3) and ORS 174.120(2), for the purposes of conventionally filing documents.¹ This closure has no impact to eFiling systems, remote access to case records, or issuance of orders or decisions.
- 3. This order documents the effect that the closure described in paragraph 2 has on any statutory time limitation that applies to any conventional filing on February 23, 2023.
- 4. The Tax Court oral argument and hearings shall proceed as scheduled and will be conducted by remote means. Public access to the arguments will be available via Webex on the court's website.
